It has been over 30 years since I became a Councillor for the Llangollen Rural Community Council, and looking back I can say I have enjoyed working alongside many councillors and clerks over this period of time. There have been quite a few changes to the role of a Community Councillor in the last thirty years and there will be a lot more to come, alongside many challenges.

We have been successful in obtaining two grants in the last six months and I would like to take this opportunity to thank Councillor Pat Jeffares and our clerk Sue Jones for their help in achieving this by attending many meetings and form filling. With the ongoing work on Postle's bridge, the Canal & River Trust is starting a few small projects to tidy up the surrounding area. The first of these is the painting of the handrail that leads towards the bridge from bridge 31 at the basin.

My C&RT colleagues and I recently donned our tatty clothes to make a start on rubbing down the old paintwork. The wire brushes soon made short work of the flaky paint and within an hour the rail was ready for



painting with Hammerite. Within another hour the paint was dry to the touch and has made the handrail look more respectable.

We will be making a start on tidying up Postle's bridge in the next few weeks but in the meantime it's back to litter picking and tidying up around the basin.

Cheese pinwheel scones

By Jan Norman

250g / 9 ozs self raising flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
30g / 1 oz unsalted butter
185ml / 6 fl oz milk
120g / 4 ¹/₂ ozs grated strong cheese
Optional 2 tablespoons chopped chives or flat-leaf parsley

Preheat oven to 210c fan190c (Gas 7)

Sift the flour, baking powder and a pinch of salt into a large mixing bowl rub in butter until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs, add the milk mix to form a soft dough, add a little flour if the dough is too sticky

Turn the dough out onto a floured surface and roll out to form a rectangle approx. 20 x 25 cm (8 x 10inch) Sprinkle the cheese and chives or parsley (optional) . Starting from the long side roll the dough into a cylinder cut into 10 equal slices Transfer the slices to a baking tray, bake for 10 - 12mins until golden and cooked through. Cool on a wire rack.

In these instances many drivers will find that insurance companies will not pay out due to the driver not taking reasonable precautions.

The proliferation of on-line shopping and the ever increasing use of computers in our daily life have unfortunately increased our risk of becoming victim of fraud or scams. Anything that appears to be 'too good to be true' is generally so and care should be taken in providing any financial or personal details. If you do not feel comfortable about a method of buying or selling it is best to seek advice and try to deal with a payment method you can trust.
